Great Bear Rainforest Takes Audiences on a Visually Stunning Journey To One of the Last Wild Places on Earth

Narrated by Ryan Reynolds and scored by Academy Award®-winning composer, Hans Zimmer, this giant-screen documentary opens at the AutoNation® IMAX 3D Theater on February 15, 2019

January 31, 2019, Fort Lauderdale, FL – Audiences will experience one of the planet's most exquisite and secluded wildernesses – Canada's Great Bear Rainforest – when the new giant-screen documentary *Great Bear Rainforest 3D* opens at the AutoNation® IMAX 3D Theater, located at Museum of Discovery and Science, on February 15, 2019. The film is locally sponsored by Save Our Seas Foundation. Brought to you by MacGillivray Freeman Films and Spirit Bear Entertainment, *Great Bear Rainforest* is narrated by actor Ryan Reynolds with music composed and arranged by the legendary Academy Award-winning composer, Hans Zimmer, and Anže Rozman. On Saturday, February 16, 2019, audiences will be able to meet the film's director and cinematographer, Ian McAllister. After the 1:40 p.m. and 3:15 p.m. screenings, he will present a slide show and share how he was able to capture such intimate and amazing footage of the Great Bear Rainforest. McAllister will do a book signing of *Great Bear Rainforest: A Giant Screen Adventure in the Land of the Spirit Bear* after the screenings. Accompanying photography exhibit is on display in the Museum for guests to enjoy.

The weekend also kicks off Distinguished Speaker Series on Saturday, February 16, 2019 with a reception at 5:30 p.m. featuring a Fireside Chat with Ian McAllister; Janie Wray, Lead Researcher and CEO of BC Whales; and Michael Scholl, CEO Save Our Seas Foundation, at 7:25 p.m. guest will enjoy a screening of Great Bear Rainforest then afterwards a presentation by McAllister followed by a book signing and viewing of the film's accompanying photography exhibit.

To continue the Distinguished Speaker Series, Janie Wray, Lead Researcher and CEO for BC Whales, will conduct a presentation on whale research in the northwest at 3:30 p.m. on February 16, 2019, 1:30 p.m. on February 17, 2019 and 1:45 p.m. on February 18, 2019.

About the Film

Hidden from the outside world, the Great Bear Rainforest is home to an immense array of wildlife, including the fabled all-white spirit bear – the rarest bear on Earth—and the indigenous First Nations people, who have provided stewardship of the forest for millennia. It is the largest temperate coastal rainforest in the world and has remained relatively

unchanged for more than 10,000 years. *Great Bear Rainforest* is the first time this pristine, wildlife-rich world will be experienced in IMAX® and giant screen theaters.

Director Ian McAllister and his crew spent three years filming throughout the remote reaches of the Great Bear Rainforest. From the underwater ocean world, through the salmon river valleys to the ice-capped peaks of the Coast Mountains, their unprecedented close-up footage of the spirit bear, along with stunning shots of the forest's coastal wolves, grizzlies, sea otters, humpback whales, sea lions, salmon and the annual herring spawn will thrill audiences who may not even know such a world exists.

"The Great Bear Rainforest is one of the last truly wild places left on Earth, and has immense value both ecologically and culturally," says director Ian McAllister. "Many people don't know about this ancient rainforest and the indigenous people who have helped protect it for thousands of years, and we hope audiences will leave theatres inspired that an extraordinary world of such natural wonder and splendor still exists."

Great Bear Rainforest is a Spirit Bear Entertainment film presented by Seaspan in association with Destination British Columbia and distributed by MacGillivray Freeman Films.
